102 of these people are Indigenous resulting in a 90% Indigenous investment in the Program.

Indigenous employees contributed **9,219** hours to the LoCP program this period, accounting for **55**% of the total hours worked.

An additional **177** Indigenous School and Ranger staff provided in kind support to the LoCP.
